Welcome everyone and thank you for coming this evening

Principal's Report: Corby Swan

- Last week we held the Week of Respect, with the following themes: Bulldogs Stomp Out Bullies,
 You Can't Take It Back Words Can Hurt, Be the Change You Wish to See in The World, and What Makes You Unique.
 Thank you to Mrs. Infante for organizing the activities.
- We have two recipients of the Principal's Character Lunch Award thus far. If you are not familiar with this, it is something that I implemented at the school a few years ago to place focus on the six pillars of character. It is not Student of the Week. I want to be clear about that. It is solely based on students who are demonstrating the six pillars of character consistently.
- An update on our School Culture and Climate Initiative: Students and staff took a School Culture and Climate survey. The staff
 worked with Kathleen McClay during our Staff Development Day. She discussed praise and encouragement and focused on
 the differences between the two.
- October 6 12 was Fire Prevention Week so we welcomed Steve Dill from the Far Hills-Bedminster Fire Department to speak with us and show equipment to our students in Grades K 2 on Friday morning.
- Over the next week, I will be speaking with all students about a service animal that we have in the school and discussing the
 differences between a service animal and a pet. We will also be discussing what we are able to do and not able to do
 regarding the service animal.
- Red Ribbon Week gives the students the opportunity to discuss what it means to live healthy and drug free. This year, we
 have collaborated with the Wellness Committee to combine Wellness Week and Red Ribbon Week in order to promote
 healthy eating, daily exercise, and making smart choices for our bodies.
- From October 23rd through October 31st, we will celebrate Red Ribbon Week which is the oldest and largest drug prevention program in the nation. For the past 19 years, we have received funding from the Municipal Alliance Commission to run this important program and many thanks to Mrs. Infante and Ms. Deckhut who lead this at our school. The 2019 National Red Ribbon Week Theme is "Send a Message. Stay Drug Free."
- Tuesday, October 29, we will be having back to back meetings of 6th grade and 8th grade parents. The 6th grade parent meeting will be about the Stokes Trip to the New Jersey School of Conservation at 6:15 pm in room 334 and the 8th grade meeting, about the Washington DC trip, will also start at 7:00 pm in room 315.
